

Adhemar S. Mineiro

An economist, graduated UFRJ (Federal University of Rio de Janeiro) in 1984, and having an especialization in Economic Theory in UNICAMP (State University of Campinas, S. Paulo).

Working since 1992 at DIEESE (Departamento Intersindical de Estatísticas e Estudos Sócio-Econômicos – Inter Union Department for Statistics and Sócio-Economical Studies). Since May 2003 working in a project of DIEESE with CUT (Brazilian Workers Confederation) and REBRIP (Brazilian Network for the Integration of People, a network of Brazilian social movements and NGOs) monitoring trade negotiations where Brasil is involved, and other international processes, as BRICS, G20, and regional processes, as Mercosur.

As part of this work, participated as observer in some of Brazilian official delegations negotiating trade agreements, such as in FTAA and WTO, for example, since 2003.

From February 2010 to the middle of 2012, was also economic advisor to TUCA (Trade Union Confederation of Americas), and from 2012 on, economic advisor to the International Secretariat of CUT (the biggest Brazilian trade union confederation).

Worked before (1986-1992) at IBASE (Brazilian Institute for Social and Economic Analysis), where coordinated for some years the project FONDAD (Fórum on Debt and Development).

Has some articles published in Brazil and abroad on economic policies, debt, development and trade issues. In 2002, together with Ivo Lesbaupin, published by Vozes Editors the book “O Desmonte da Nação em Dados”, evaluating Brazilian economy in the period 1995-2001.

Former member of the board of the Economists Union of Rio de Janeiro (1987-2001), including a three year period (1992-1994) when coordinated the union. President of the Regional Council of Economists of Rio de Janeiro (1997-1998) and member of the board of the Brazilian Federal Council of Economists, from 1999 to 2001, where coordinator of the working group on foreign affairs. From 2000 to 2002, also president of AEALC (Latin American and the Caribbean Economists Association).
